FROM THE RECTOR

Alleluia! Christ is risen! ("He is risen indeed! Alleluia!")

He is Risen!

He is Risen Indeed!

Over many centuries, this is how the church has joyfully responded to the great Easter proclamation.

What calls forth such a response of joy and worship?

It is the glorious good news of reassurance and restoration that comes with the resurrection of our Lord.

On that most glorious of mornings, the whole church in heaven and on earth rejoiced and responded, "He Is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!"

That is what the angel said to the women at the tomb, "I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he

Here is the great fact of the resurrection stated. or perhaps I should say, understated, in simple vet profound words. The reality of the resurrection itself is the first thing

that grabs our attention. Jesus really died and was buried. Now He is alive. risen from the dead! On the cross Christ finished the work of our redemption, and now his resurrection testifies to the infinite worth and the astonishing effects of his atoning sacrifice. Nothing else would do, only the holy precious blood of the Son of God come in the flesh.

This is how much God loves you and has acted to save you from your sins and the death you deserve. Easter shows that Good Friday was enough; it did the job of paying for sin and overcoming death. The crucifixion and the resurrection together declare the glory of the Lord and guarantee our salvation.

Now you would think that such a proclamation of a glorious and mighty

resurrection would bring nothing but pure joy. But the text says that the women "departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy." Yes, their joy was great, and it certainly predominated, yet it was mixed with fear. In some way, I suppose this was understandable. Any contact with the awesome power of the Almighty causes us sinners to tremble with fear.

We too find this thing incredible, this amazing power of God which raised our

Lord from the dead. But equally impressive, if not more so, is the amazing grace of the risen Lord! This grace is reassuring and restorative. It relieves our fears and restores us to fellowship.

Jesus meets the frightened women and calms their fears. "He greets them with a word of happiness and wellbeing. And happiness and iov certainly come to

these women, for now they see Jesus before them and hear His voice. Then Jesus gives them even more reassurance: "Do not be afraid."

Fear not, for the perfect love of Christ drives out our fears. Fear of punishment, fear of God's judgment, fear of death; all these are overcome by the comforting voice of Jesus our Saviour. Jesus speaks these same words of reassurance to us today: "Greetings! Do not be afraid. I have risen from the dead. I have conquered the grave. I am not angry with you. Indeed, I have good news for you! Be reassured by my resurrection."

In a few days around 8th March there were reports from Highways of road signs being damaged/ removed on Newton Lane Tattenhall towards the Candle Factory direction. Highways informed the police that this is not the first report. If anyone has any information please call the police on 101.

The police will be continuing to monitor speeding throughout the area over the next few months and where possible will be deploying both the SID (Speed Indicator Device) and TrueCam with a view to deterring and where necessary prosecuting those who do not abide by the speed limits. We are currently also arranging Driver Engagement days in the area.

There have been further numerous reports of uncontrolled loose dogs running wild in fields where there is livestock. It may seem harmless to the average dog walker but it can affect the livelihood of local landowners. If you were not already aware farmers have the right to shoot any dog dead that is seen out of control on their land and in addition that they can also prosecute

the dog owner for any losses.

There were two reports of suspicious males one loitering at the back of houses on the Park, and another near a property where building work was being carried out. Please contact the Police with your suspicions at the time when seen. They always welcome your call as it is too late for them to be as affective when it is reported long after the person has possibly left the area. There were reports of anti social behaviour and drug use in a particular area of Tattenhall which was observed by passing residents. 

During Open Forum at the beginning of the March Parish Council meeting, our new Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Rachael McKevitt, introduced herself. Although new to Tattenhall, she has 11 years' service with the Police Force, having recently returned from maternity leave. One of her first initiatives would be a revamp of the monthly report issued on police incidents in our rural area. She also hoped to highlight topical issues. It was reported to Rachael during Open Forum that anti-social behaviour was continuing in Keysbrook Avenue. Unfortunately, no incidents had been reported recently and Rachael appealed to the public for information, anonymously if need be by calling 101. If incidents were not reported the Police could not know about them. Items of interest from the Agenda: The Parish Council was in favour of the Chairman's plan to draw up an Annual Plan for the parish, listing projects and

work to be undertaken. A working party would be established to draw up the Plan which would be published at the Annual Meeting.

Councillor Black reported that children from the School Council at the Park School had been involved in choosing the design for the two recycling bins to be placed on the new play area. The chosen designs would be installed when delivered.

Cllr White updated on planned events for the Armistice commemorations, this November. These would mostly take place at the Barbour Institute and

around the adjacent War Memorial. Two wooden benches will be installed at the War Memorial, to enable quiet reflection at any time. Funding for the benches had been provided by the plastic bag initiative Morton's Spar, Tattenhall. The village would also take part in the Silent Soldiers project when silhouettes of WWI soldiers will be displayed from September in remembrance of those in the armed forces who came hoke, as well as those who never made it Cllr Chapman updated on the Community Land Trust reporting that February had been a difficult month being 'one step forward, two back'. There were proposed site meetings with architects and a meeting with John Heselwood of Cheshire Community Action, who undertook the Housing Needs Survey (HNS) late last year. The results of the HNS are currently lodged with Cheshire West & Chester Council, which sponsored the Survey and whose permission is required before a summary can be published. Members of the Board also met up with Antoinette Sandbach MP in late February, to highlight the difficulties and to enlist her support. All residents are invited to attend Parish Council meetings and can raise items under Open Forum (15 minutes) at the start of the meeting. We meet upstairs in the Billiard Room of the Barbour Institute on the first Monday of the month @ 7.30pm. Councillor Sheila Chapman


