FROM THE RECTOR

What is Lent?



Lent is a word that comes from the Anglo Saxon word 'lencten', which mean "spring".

The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness enduring the temptation of the devil and preparing His ministry.

The dates of Lent are defined by the date of Easter, which is a moveable feast, meaning that it falls on a different date each year.

Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, a day after Shrove Tuesday. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the resurrection of Christ.

What do we do as Christians during Lent?

Lent is a penitential period, involving the dual disciplines of abstinence and fasting.

During Lent many Christians commit to fasting or giving up certain foods, habits or luxuries - for example meat, cakes and sweets, alcohol, smoking -

for its duration (the money saved is often then donated to charity). This is done both as a form of penitence and as a spiritual tool to tame the body and 'sharpen the spirit' for prayer, reflection and contemplation in preparation for the celebration of Easter.

Apart from giving up chocolates, fizzy drinks or chips, many others use Lent as a period of time to help others. Hundreds of people take part in the Lenten Positive Challenge as another way to show praise for God. Christians perform one positive act for each of the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. These positive acts can include calling up someone who is lonely, donating to a worthy cause or even letting someone go ahead of you in a queue



Questions were raised by members of the community about speeding on the A41 (in particular late night HGV traffic); gritting routes, in particular on the railway bridge at Newton and Frog Lane, and the lack of parking availability on Chester road by the school.

Other residents were concerned about various planning applications, including the proposed new build on Keysbrook Avenue. The Parish Council would be responding to all applications when there was an official application had been received.

A resident raised the question of why the Glebe Meadow is often locked. The Parish Council responded by explaining how the land was a very rare example of unimproved grassland, and it was very keen to maintain this.

Matthew Morris from Bolesworth spoke about a few changes within the parking arrangements in Barbour Square, but assured of no detrimental effect to the overall situation.

After the open forum section of the meeting, the official agenda items were discussed:

Redrow had been reported for working

outside the agreed working hours, and were now being monitored by CWaC.

The flooding on Chester road had been reported to the highways department of CWaC, but it was unlikely that anything could be done to resolve the issue until the waters had subsided.

The final Precept figure had been agreed at the finance committee meeting. There would be a small increase as well as a levy of £10 per Band D property as the parish council wanted to financially support the Operation Shield. Please see the item on below for further information.

Potholes were yet again discussed. It was also mentioned that anybody who wanted to report a pothole could do so easily via CWaC's website.

A local business had offered to provide another bin for the new play area and the children of the Park School would be consulted on the design to be bought.

A meeting of those involved in the Armistice Commemoration weekend in November would be held.

The next monthly meeting would be on 5th March at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute.

Parish Council Precept for 2018/19

Each year, in January, the Finance Committee of the Parish Council meets to look at what money will be needed in the coming year to pay for budgeted items. This funding forms part of your Council Tax and allows the Parish Council to deliver the services for which it is responsible.

Parish Council Precept contd.

Two years ago, there was a small percentage increase in the Precept rate, but there was also a levy of £10 on each Band D household to raise funds to rebuild the play area in the centre of the village, which is now a fantastic asset for our community.

In 2018/19, the Parish Council intends to levy a similar one-off £10 payment per Band D property so that Operation Shield can be made available to every property in the parish.

Operation Shield is a police initiative which works by using unique DNA liquid to mark property in your home. The DNA coding is linked solely to your address so that if goods are stolen and then recovered, they can be traced back to you.

Each household will receive one kit free of charge and additional kits can be bought at modest cost from the police. The parish will be able to put up signs showing that Operation Shield is used in the area and results have shown that crime figures are much reduced when thieves realise that property is protected with DNA liquid.

Tattenhall is one of the last parishes in Cheshire to take part in Operation Shield and the Parish Council feels that it would be of great benefit to all residents.

Including the £10 one-off levy will raise a Precept of £48,384 meaning a payment of £46.49 per Band D property. Bands A to C pay less than this, bands E and above pay more. These figures were recommended to the Parish Council and were approved at the Extra-Ordinary meeting held on 22nd January 2018.
