

Yvonne and I have just been tying up the loose ends of the Armistice Centenary.

Without doubt, the village bathed in the success of this weekend and every comment has been congratulatory and positive - thank you so much for being the lead on all of this.

There has also been considerable feedback.

Something which has arisen is what is happening with the Poster Exhibition information.

It was terrific to see that the Exhibition was extended - regrettably there were some disappointed individuals who arrived yesterday and a school party (possibly from the Centre) as it was being dismantled.

I believe that there are monies left in the 'Armistice Budget' and am wondering whether Tattenhall Local History might place a bid against this, or separately if protocols of the PC require this.

So many people asked whether we could publish some of these posters (and more) in an A4 style book.

Naturally some of the information will be archived to the history website but not everyone engages with this (or Tattenhall Online) and it seems fitting to publish this information (and some in relation to Burwardsley), thus drawing a line under our commemorations. It would be perfect to publish this to coincide with June 1919 - i.e. the fighting may have stopped on 11 November but the first of the peace treaties was not signed until the following June.

Yvonne and I are quite prepared to obtain the necessary quotations and the Historical Trail Pamphlet and the Interpretation Panel are evidence of the quality that is achievable.

So, wondering when you intend to call a debriefing/feedback meeting of the Armistice Committee and whether this might be raised at that.
